

Good evening parents, this is Vaughn White, Superintendent of Hesperia Community Schools with a brief message.

Parents, the Governor enacted the "Stay Home, Stay Safe" order today that places significant limitations on public gathering. We have been fortunate to transport student meals to homes this last week, but now we are obligated to transition to a new process that will significantly reduce the opportunity for our volunteers to be infected by the virus.

We will no longer be distributing food on Monday, Wednesdays, and Fridays. Food will now be available at pick up sites on the district premises on Tuesdays and Thursdays to limit the amount of opportunity for exposure. This process will begin on Thursday, March 26th and will follow each Tuesday and Thursday after that through, April 9th. We will not be distributing lunches Wednesday, March 25th.

Distribution of food will take place at the bell tower entrance on the Northside of the building, at the elementary office on the Southside of the building and at the middle school office on the West side of the building. Pick up will be between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. and students will receive a 3 day supply of breakfasts and lunches.

It is important that those picking up food from the buildings stay in their vehicles and signal to the volunteers how many meals they need to feed their children. You may choose what distribution point you wish to drive up to. If the line is too long, just drive around the building to another site.

Parents, we are experiencing unprecedented circumstances. We are grateful for the many volunteers that have helped through this process and thankful for their many tireless hours. We can only pray that by obeying the Governor's proclamation we can get through this crisis. We truly miss our kids and hope we can see them in April!
