Special Education Report

- Due to a social worker leaving at NCRESA some shifting in staff had to take place. We have now been given Emily Theil who will be a behavior support specialist district wide for all K-12 students. This is a general education support that is available with parent consent based on team recommendations. Emily will be with us full time, which is an increase in services from 3 days to 5 days, which is an added benefit. We are working to collect additional parent consents to fill her availability and caseload. Emily has schooling and certifications as a BCBA (Board Certified Behavior Analyst) and is excited to be in Hesperia full time.
- We are working hard to keep all deadlines for IEPs and evaluations, which was an added challenge the last two weeks with snow days. A number of students are having to be evaluated virtually due to our school psychologist being out on medical leave. He still does not have a return date, so we are utilizing any and all staff available to help fill in our needs.
- Mr. Wells and Mr. Dent are teaming together to create more of a life skill curriculum for their students who are following a certificate of completion track. They are working on community connections and trips that can make learning more real while providing their students with opportunities to build their functional living skills.
